



Thank you for being part of our 27th season of Shakespeare in the Park. Since 1989 GreenStage has been bringing free theater to Puget Sound audiences. Washington's longest running Shakespeare company, GreenStage's programs reach 13,000 people in parks throughout Puget Sound. We present the Seattle Outdoor Theater Festival, which has become the unofficial launch of the summer outdoor theater season. With the addition of Backyard Bard, our season now includes four park shows, and this year we bring back our popular Hard Bard Halloween Show. All Free – all the time.

While preparing to write this note I had a particularly bad day and thought to myself, 'who cares, does it even matter?' The answer came swiftly and was a resounding "It is imperative!" To that end we have developed programs that help schools to fill the gap left by budget cuts for the arts. Over the past 27 years countless people have participated in GreenStage; on stage, behind the scenes, and in our audiences. How they have been touched and what they have been moved to do as a result is limitless to know. Take a moment and look around you; at this beautiful park and this beautiful community of souls all joined together to create this moment – this one moment that you will share and will never be again, but whose ripples are infinite.

ABOUT BACKYARD BARD

Four actors perform a total of over thirty roles in these two plays, and each play is cut down to under one hour.

Backyard Bard was born when GreenStage was asked to perform at a backyard party. A two hour production with fifteen actors was far too big for the space, and too long for party entertainment, so we answered the challenge with *Tiny Twelfth Night*, a version of the play under an hour long and with only four actors.

Now in its third year as part of our regular season, we're excited to bring our first tiny tragedy to the stage with the Backyard Bard Macbeth. Both shows are a perfect introduction to Shakespeare for younger audiences.

THE TWO GENTLEMEN OF VERONA

Love can be complicated. Proteus, mad for Julia, stays in Verona while his pal Valentine heads off to the court of Milan to make his way in the world. Proteus' father decides it is time his son did something with his life, and declares that he shall follow Valentine. Proteus and Julia exchange rings and promises of love before Proteus sets out tearfully for Milan.

In Milan, Valentine has fallen in love with Silvia, the Duke's daughter, who is resisting her father's wish that she marry his friend Thurio. Proteus arrives in Milan just as Valentine and Silvia are planning to elope. At first sight of Silvia, Proteus forgets Julia, who has followed him from Verona disguised as the page

Sebastian. Proteus tells the Duke of Valentine's plot, which results in Valentine's banishment. Silvia runs away to find Valentine. Proteus follows Silvia, and Julia/Sebastian follows Proteus.

What will happen in the forest? Can they iron this out? How will a group of four actors portray a band of outlaws? Which one of them is really the dog?

MACBETH

Blind ambition can be a person's undoing.

Generals Macbeth and Banquo, on the way home from battle, encounter three weird women, who address Macbeth as Thane of Cawdor and King, and Banquo as the father of kings. Macbeth soon learns that King Duncan of Scotland has named him Thane of Cawdor for his actions in the wars, and his imagination is captured by the potential to be King.

He and his wife, Lady Macbeth, decide to speed the prophecies along a bit. They murder Duncan in his sleep and accuse his guards of the deed. Fearing the prophecy about Banquo, the newly crowned Macbeth engages an assassin to murder Banquo and his son, Fleance.

Macbeth visits the witches again and is told "none of woman born" shall harm him, and that he shall never be defeated until the forest outside his castle moves.

Are the witches just pulling his leg, or will their predictions prove true? Can Macbeth hold on to a crown achieved through murder? What happens when you trust strange prophecy, murder your friends, and betray all those around you?

Simple Summaries of the Summer Shows



MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING

There's romance and treachery afoot in Messina! Don Pedro, Prince of Aragon, and his soldiers return from a successful battle and are invited to spend a celebratory month at the home of Governor Leonato. Rising-star soldier, Claudio, has an eye for Leonato's daughter, Hero, and Beatrice, Leonato's niece, resumes her longstanding war of wit with Benedick, an avowed bachelor.

While Don Pedro cooks up an elaborate plan to trick Beatrice and Benedick into admitting their true love for each other, the Prince's wicked brother, Don John, decides to stir up trouble. Young love is put to the test when Don John and his friends deceive Claudio into thinking Hero has been unfaithful. With her innocent cousin slandered, Beatrice leaps to Hero's defense and enlists the aid of Benedick to set things right. But it is the hilarious constable Dogberry, master of the malapropism, and his crack group of night watchmen that keep Don John from getting away with besmirching Hero's reputation. Loyalties are tested in this comedy of love, betrayal, and redemption.



THE TWO NOBLE KINSMEN

Love is a double-edged sword!

Two noble Theban cousins, Palamon and Arcite, become prisoners of ignoble war when Athens battles Thebes. From their jail cell, the men catch sight of royal Emilia and both fall madly in love with her. Their friendship instantly turns into a bitter rivalry, and they determine to fight each other for Emilia's hand. Arcite is released and banished from Athens but he returns in disguise and wrangles a job as Emilia's bodyguard. Meanwhile, the Jailer's Daughter falls in love with Palamon and helps him escape. Still hung up on Emilia, however, he abandons the Jailer's Daughter, who goes mad with unrequited love. Eventually, Palamon and Arcite do battle in a high-stakes tournament. The winner will earn the hand of the princess Emilia; the loser will be executed. Who will prevail?

The Two Noble Kinsmen was co-written by Shakespeare and John Fletcher and is based on Chaucer's The Knight's Tale.

I do love nothing in the world so well as you- is not that strange? -Benedick Act IV, Scene I

I love this play. For years I have been asking Erin Day when we would see it again in the GreenStage season, and oh by the way, I'd love to direct. So, before I say anything more, I want to say thank you. Thank you Erin for trusting me with this jewel and thank you to everyone involved with GreenStage.

So, why do I love this play? It has everything: the young lovers, the witty lovers, the devious brother and his pals, the silly foil, the caring father, the good-natured prince and ladies who speak their minds. And don't forget music, dancing, a wedding and a funeral. It is the kitchen sink of Shakespearean Comedy.

As a director, the challenge is in giving weight to each of these aspects and driving the play at a good pace. Ultimately we are here to tell a story. At the root of this story is the foundation of any good relationship, trust, and how our love can be lost when trust is lost.

"For it falls out That what we have we prize not to the worth Whiles we enjoy it, but being lacked and lost, Why, then we rack the value, then we find The virtue that possession would not show us While it was ours."

- Friar, Act IV, Scene I

I never understood why Claudio falls for Borachio and Don John's ruse. Doesn't he trust Hero? Don't Don Pedro and Claudio feel that something must be off here? But the older I get the more I know it is true: we trust our eyes above all. They see the deception, and once we see something it is almost impossible to break us of the idea that what we saw is the truth. As a cast member put it, when we put someone on a pedestal, it is surprisingly easy to knock them down (thanks, Lorrie). And so I have come to love Claudio and his humanness and Shakespeare for finding a way to make it right with a Hero reborn and a man who learns that if you trust your heart above all, then love will follow.

THE TWO NOBLE KINSMEN

This is a play about connections: a person and their philosophy, their past, their responsibilities, their friends, their family, their loves. These connections are the result of an individual's decisions. So many of Shakespeare's works examine the landscape of the mind in making a decision and the tumult it causes that person. This play is different. The most succinct and intuitive piece of writing I found in my research of this play puts it best:

"Two Noble Kinsmen is not primarily about psychology of character or the moral implications of choices made or declined. It is about the resolution of an apparently irresolvable dilemma and the passions that dilemma generates." - Patricia Tatspaugh

Having moved past the moment of decision, we are able to see how the ramifications of a decision continue to spread outward. We see one choice affecting many others and their own connections. People question their past, burn bridges, draw new lines, forge new futures. It is a fascinating look at what it means to be a person. Ultimately this play is about us and what we've decided is important. What have you tied yourself to?

BACKYARD BARD

The Two Gentlemen of Verona and **Macbeth** come from vastly different ends of Shakespeare's canon.

Two Gents is one of Shakespeare's earliest comedies, and is filled with rhyming couplets, witty banter, and the seeds of some of Shakespeare's greatest characters and themes. It is also seen by some as a troublesome play due to some slightly vague text in the final scene. The interpretation of this text has taken wildly different turns over the years, sometimes going to the point of taking this light, silly comedy into a very dark and tragic place. With this production, we're sticking to the comedy, and I hope your experience with it will bring smiles and laughter.

Macbeth is on the other end of the Shakespeare spectrum, and is one of the greatest tragic plays in the English language. The Macbeths are arguably one of Shakespeare's happiest married couple, but their desire for power takes them on a fast paced ride into a madhouse. Lady Macbeth faces an internal madness fueled by the guilt of their actions. Macbeth is faced with fighting of real and imagined threats to his crown and sanity. Neither one of them sleeps very well at night. Let it be a lesson to you that there are always unseen consequences to your actions if you choose to blindly believe the prophesies of wild and weird women on the heath.

(Hero)




