Trickery abounds! Count Claudio and Hero are in love and getting married. But when the despicable Don John tricks Claudio into thinking that Hero has been unfaithful, Claudio accuses her in front of everyone at the wedding! Meanwhile, Hero's witty cousin Beatrice and Claudio's waggish friend Benedick (both happily single) are each tricked into thinking the other is in love with them. Will Claudio find out the truth about Hero? Will Benedick and Beatrice admit they love each other? Will Don John be brought to justice? We'll find out as we explore this beloved comedy.

Students will memorize and perform a cutting of this play. Besides working on acting, students will play games while learning to speak and understand Shakespeare's language. An hour-long performance for friends and family on Friday.

HAMLET
